

County Road Report

Court members discussed the Road Grader Bids received at the last court meeting. After some discussion, it was agreed to try to negotiate with the lowest bidder to try to get a more affordable price.

Some county roads have been blacktopped recently and some edging still needs to be completed.

State Road Report

After discussion, court members agreed to use the Flex Funds for work on Whites Run; Discretionary Funds for work on Goose Creek; and have in-place patching performed on Mound Hill Road.

County Judge Comments

Judge Tomlinson advised the court that he expects the Summer Work Program to begin around July 1. The work will last 8 weeks and pay will be between \$8-\$10 per hour.

Jim Hamilton, former Deputy Sheriff sent a letter of request to the fiscal court asking permission to keep his service and back-up service weapons due to his recent resignation/retirement. After some discussion, the court declined the request stating that usually those requests are granted to the elected official (Sheriff).

Tim Hendrick was on hand to answer questions pertaining to the Extension Service funding the Fiscal Court sends quarterly. It is in the contract that there be a 6 month retainer in the account at all times. However, with the recent proration of fees due to the fact that the 4H Programmer vacancy has not been filled, too much money was prorated, and therefore the county needs to pay back the difference to maintain the 6 month retainer. Once the retainer has been replenished, the county will not have to pay for the 4H Programmer until the vacancy has been filled.

Magistrate Comments

Bates—Hwy 36E and Martin Road needs lighting.

Bowling—Lights are out again on Kentucky River Bridge and need repair.
