

HOW TO VOTE IN CARROLL COUNTY

The ABSENTEE PORTAL is now open at govoteky.com (Link in comments) for anyone that needs to apply for an absentee ballot. You must complete the questions and chose from one of the options listed. See first picture below. Once this is done a ballot will be mailed to you. DO NOT apply for an Absentee Ballot if you plan to vote in person, as you can only do one or the other. Once voted, you have the option to return by mail at \$1.56 postage or drop them into the election drop boxes located right inside in the front and back doors of the courthouse. Please follow enclosed directions for either option.

IN PERSON ABSENTEE/EARLY VOTING will begin on MAY 4-6 and MAY 9-11. You will be able to come into our office at the normal office hours of 8:30-4:30 to vote. One of the choices in the second picture below must apply to you.

NO EXCUSE IN PERSON ABSENTEE VOTING/EARLY VOTING will begin on MAY 12, 13 and 14th. Our office will be open from 8:00-6:00 each of those days. We will be located at the courthouse at 440 Main Street on the 2nd floor. There is an elevator in the hallway for anyone that may need this assistance.

ELECTION DAY is MAY 17, 2022. All precincts will vote at General Butler Conference Center from 6 am to 6 pm. Signage for handicap entrance will be posted, and handicap parking will be available in the upper parking lot.

Online Absentee Request: 2022 Primary Election

Requirements to vote absentee.

I am not able to appear at the polls on election day due to the selected reason below:

- 1. I am a covered voter under the Kentucky Uniform Military and Overseas Act, KRS 117A.010
- 2. I am a student who temporarily resides outside the county of my residence.
- 3. I am incarcerated in jail but have not been convicted of the crime for which I have been charged.
- 4. I have changed my place of residence to a different state during a period in which my new state's voter registration books are closed (you will receive a ballot only for the offices of President and Vice-President of the United States).
- 5. I am temporarily residing outside of Kentucky but am still eligible to vote in the state
- 6. I will be absent from my county of residence on Election Day and on all of the days that in-person absentee voting is conducted .
- 7. I am a participant in the Secretary of State's crime victim address confidentiality program.
- 8. I am not able to appear at the polls on Election Day or on the days in-person absentee voting is conducted on account of age, disability, or illness and I have not been declared mentally disabled by a court of competent jurisdiction.

If you do not meet these minimum requirements, you may still vote in person,

9.	Person who due to age, disability, or illness will be unable to go to the polls on election day. <i>(Sign statement 1 below.)</i>
10.	Voter who will be outside the county on election day. <i>(Sign statement 1 below.)</i>
11.	Student who temporarily resides outside the county in which he is registered who will be out of the county on election day. <i>(Sign statement 1 below.)</i>
12.	Voter who is a member of the Armed Forces or a dependent of a member of the Armed Forces and will be out of the county on election day. <i>(Sign statement 1 below.)</i>
13.	Voter who is a member of the Armed Forces who will be confined to base within the county on election day and who learns of that confinement within 7 days or less of the election. <i>(Sign statement 1 below.)</i>
14.	Voter who is a citizen residing overseas and will be out of the county on election day. <i>(Sign statement 1 below.)</i>
15.	Voter or spouse of voter who has surgery scheduled that will require hospitalization on election day. <i>(Sign statement 1 below.)</i>
16.	Precinct Election Officer serving in a precinct other than that in which he is registered or an Alternate Precinct Election Officer. <i>(Sign statement 1 below.)</i>
17.	Member or any staff for the County Board of Elections; Any deputy county clerk; Any staff for the State Board of Elections. <i>(Sign statement 1 below.)</i>
18.	FOR PRESIDENTIAL BALLOT ONLY: Moved to another state after its registration books closed.
19.	A woman in her last trimester of pregnancy. <i>(Sign statement 2 below.)</i>

FAQ

*How can I register to vote? Individuals can go to elect.ky.gov or come into the Carroll County Clerk's Office.

*What is the last day to register to vote? April 19, 2022 for the May Primary.

*How old do I have to be to register to vote? As long as you will be 18 by November 8, 2022 (General Election), you can register and begin voting during the May Primary.

*How can I find out my party affiliation (how I'm registered)? Registered voters can go online to elect.ky.gov or call our office at 502-732-7005.

*Is it too late to change my party affiliation and still be eligible to vote in the Primary? Yes, voters must have changed party affiliation by December 31, 2021, in order to vote in the May Primary.

*What is the difference between the May Primary and the November General Election? Qualified registered voters of each party select the candidates from their own party. The winner will advance to the General Election in November. **Party restrictions DO NOT apply for the General Election in November.**
